

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations...."

Our Parish's Mission: To Be Disciples and to Make Disciples

Here are Jesus' final instructions to His disciples in the Gospel of Matthew, which the Church calls "The Great Commission":

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Amen." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Our Lord has called all members of our parish, both you and me, not only to be disciples—but also to make disciples. The most important thing in my life and work as a priest is to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ also calls every parishioner of St. Sophia church to become His disciple. An Orthodox Christian parish that truly follows Jesus Christ is made up of disciples who make disciples.

Everything we say or do at this parish must serve to fulfill this calling to discipleship. Whatever we say or do that does NOT serve to fulfill this calling must be questioned. This is the Lord's very command.

What do disciples do? Disciples yearn to know Christ and to be known by Him. They study Him, his commandments, wisdom, teaching and actions, and try to imitate Him as best as they can. They are Christ-

obsessed. They hang on Jesus' every word. They seek His will and desires. They serve others and sacrifice for others. They try to understand the mind of the Church and the reasons for its acts, decisions, councils, and teachings. They knowledgeably participate in the Liturgical life... not just performing the correct actions, but knowing how they reveal the Father, Son and Holy Spirit's presence in our lives and how they draw us to life in the Trinity. Disciples understand in their hearts and minds that they are privileged to be Christians. Disciples imitate their Teacher by forgiving others "up to seventy times seven."

Jesus clearly commands that His disciples, including St. Sophia parishioners, receive His Body and Blood whenever His Church offers it. They never made excuses for their absence. Attendance is non-negotiable. Yes, showing up to Liturgy is also a commandment from Christ Himself- see John 6:53-58:

Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you. Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in me, and I in him. As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me,

even he shall live by me. This is that bread which came down from heaven: not as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead: he that eateth of this bread shall live for ever.

Receiving Communion and partaking of the Sacraments is neither optional nor based on "when one feels like it." It is a duty and an obligation for disciples to prepare and receive. An Orthodox Christian feels like missing the Eucharist is spiritual starvation. Orthodox disciples not only show up to every service, they show up as walking, talking, repenting, maturing, honest, faithful, trustworthy, patient, forgiving, humble, pure, innocent, harmless images of Christ. Christ's mind is their mind. The Lord's will is their will.

We must look out for each other and protect those who are vulnerable. Every Orthodox Christian man is a father and brother to fellow parishioners and those who desire to become disciples. Likewise, every Orthodox Christian woman is a mother and sister who welcome, cherish, serve and protect each visitor that shows up at our door. We must all recognize that Christ Himself sent that visitor to our parish and has entrusted their souls to our care.

Jesus Christ directs us to go out and invite people of "all the nations" to become Orthodox disciples. This means those beyond our own community, to invite each and every person in Bellingham, Ferndale and Whatcom County and make them disciples as well. By "the nations" Jesus means peoples of all races, as St. Paul adds, whether they are "Jew or Greek, male or female, slave or free." We must reach out to all people who are living apart from God in darkness and bring them to the light of Jesus Christ. We are to go to those who are yearning for an illumined, light-filled life, and offer it to them by inviting them to become disciples with us.

We are to teach... and be taught. We are to become students, which is what word disciple means.

We have a job to do, and one job only: to become ourselves and to make others into disciples... as many as we possibly can. We are to imitate Christ by serving, not expecting to be served. We are faithful to Christ, the Orthodox Church and this parish to the end, no matter what. If we do not always get what we want, we persevere and serve anyway. If a person thinks "I don't get anything out of our parish, so I am not going to come back," that person is wrong-headed and doesn't understand the goals and objective of Christ's Church.

Our Lord has blessed us with our Community of St. Sophia. Jesus Christ Himself has given each of the faithful of St. Sophia a holy calling and great responsibility. If we drive people away, either intentionally or unintentionally, we will answer to our Lord on Judgment day, both as individual members and as a community.

However, if we fulfill our mission to make disciples, we stand to gain so much as a parish! Your faith will be deeper and more rich. Christ will award us as "good and faithful servants" if we grow in our faith, repent, forgive each other and bring new people to share the holy life in Christ as offered by our Greek Orthodox Church.

Michael has decided that our parish will participate with other area churches in the "Family Promise" program, a program of the Interfaith Coalition that supports homeless families. Below is a thank you letter from its director, Laura Harker, that describes this ministry. If you would like to support and or participate in this holy ministry, please see Fr. Michael.



Thank You for Supporting Family Promise of Whatcom County!

Many of us have had the delight of listening to a Sunday School Choir singing "Jesus Loves the Little Children" and we are familiar with the gospel stories in Matthew and Mark of Jesus blessing children, saying the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these. Yet not all of us have had the opportunity to show Jesus' love for the youngest among us outside of our own family and friends.

By agreeing to be a host congregation for Family Promise of Whatcom County, a program of Interfaith Coalition, your congregation is expressing the love of Jesus in a tangible, far-reaching way. You will be meeting the urgent needs of vulnerable homeless children and their families in our community for safety, shelter, and meals.

The premise of Family Promise is simple. Congregations open their facilities for one week quarterly throughout the year to 4 or 5 families, offering a place to have dinner, spend evening time together, sleep, and have breakfast. They are then transported to a centralized Day Center, where families have access to showers, laundry facilities and social services, and children get picked up for school. At dinner time, they are transported back to the congregation.

The process to implement the Family Promise program is progressing well under the auspices of Interfaith Coalition. So far, 10 congregations have signed on to be host congregations, and 4 have agreed to support them. An enthusiastic and energized core group of volunteers continues to recruit host and support congregations, work on finding a suitable Day Center, communicating the vision of the program, and raising working capital. The hope is to have the program up and running in early 2018.

Your help in embodying Jesus' love is a blessing. Thank you for your commitment to meet the needs of the growing number of homeless children in our community.
